After he explained a bit more to us, we all got one tablet per group and a Lego kit. We all got a turn of using the tablet and building the Lego.

When most of us were finished building, the teacher told us to come up to the top and sit down. He showed us how to make it drive. Next, the teacher told us that we had to pass a driving test. He showed us how to connect our robots to the tablet.

We had to move blocks on the tablet to make the robot go forwards and to turn. After we all got the hang of it, the teacher showed us the first challenge. After that, the teacher brought us over to a maze made from tape on the floor and we had a lot of fun taking turns trying out the maze. Finally, we cleaned up and made sure we put all the colours back in the right box. It was great fun!
